Green business gets attention

The Center for Green Building in Black Rock has received national attention by appearing on HGTV's "HouseSmarts" program due to its non-toxic structure and the home products available in the 5,000-square-foot showroom.

American clay wall plaster was the featured eco-product for the "HouseSmarts" episode on the national cable-TV network. The product is all natural, mold resistant, easy to repair, non-fading, and comes in more than 40 colors and various textural finishes.

The Center for Green Building, established in 1998, also appeared on the front

page of The New York Times' Sunday Connecticut section on April 20.

In addition, the business received the Community Impact Award from the Community Economic Development Fund and the Business Environmental Leadership Award from the Fairfield County Environmental Justice Network for being environmentally responsible and serving the needs of the community.

The Fairfield Avenue establishment is owned by Erin Buckley and Jonathan Tuminski, who seek to educate subcontractors in green-building techniques.
